SCORING

The low-point scoring system (*U S SAILING ASSOCIATION - THE RACING RULES OF SAILING 2009-2012* Appendix A) will be used. The regatta will consist of five races, four of which will be counted for the regatta results. In the event one, or more, race(s) being cancelled, all completed races will be counted. A minimum of three yachts is necessary for a class. Those sailing under the Portsmouth Yardstick published in March, 2008, will use the D-PN (no wind factor) numbers. A Portsmouth handicap number may be changed by the Race Committee for boat modifications beyond class rules or U.S. Sailing's Portsmouth Yardstick (check with principal race officer if you're unsure).

If allowed, fires must be to the beach side of vegetation.

The use of amplified music or excessively loud musical instruments is prohibited.

Overnight parking at the trailhead to the beach is prohibited. Be sure your crew and/or guests are aware of this. This is a problem each year.

Take your garbage out with you - leave the beach cleaner than when you arrived.
