SCORING

The low-point scoring system (*U.S. SAILING ASSOCIATION - THE RACING RULES OF SAILING 2021-2024* Appendix A) will be used. The regatta will consist of five races, four of which will be counted for the regatta results. In the event one, or more, race(s) are canceled, all completed races will be counted. A minimum of three yachts is necessary for a class. Those sailing under the North American Portsmouth Yardstick, published by U.S. Sailing, will use the D-PN (no wind factor) numbers. Current D-PN tables are available at <https://www.ussailing.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/01/2017-Portsmouth-Precalculated-Classes.pdf>. A Portsmouth handicap number will be assigned by the Race Committee for boat modifications beyond class rules or for designs not listed by the U.S. Sailing's Portsmouth Yardstick (check with principal race officer if you're unsure).

POINT REYES NATIONAL SEASHORE PARK RULES

There are toilets at the camping site; however, there is NO POTABLE WATER available at the camp site. Please be sure to bring sufficient water with you. NO COOKING OR CAMPFIRE ARE PERMITTED UNLESS advised otherwise by a park ranger or SRSC officer on the beach. Permits are required for campfires (the Club has three), but even so such permits cannot be exercised if the Park deems the fire danger to be too high. If allowed, cooking fires must be in contained vessels, and any ashes produced must be removed from the beach. Call Park Headquarters 1-415-464-5100 ext 2 if you wish to know the current fire status before you sail to Marshall Beach. If allowed, fires must be to the beach side of vegetation. The use of amplified music or excessively loud musical instruments is prohibited. Overnight parking at the trailhead to the beach is prohibited. Be sure your crew and/or guests are aware of this. This is a problem each year. Take your garbage out with you--leave the beach cleaner than when you arrived.
